

18

Get cozy with Dan Bar-el's *The Very, Very, Far North*, illustrated by Kelly Pousette. Introduce the book with a look into animals of the arctic region.

19

Eve Bunting's Birthday: Create edible outdoor tree ornaments for wildlife just like the family did in Night Tree. 20
